
PURPOSES

DESCRIPTION OF OUR ACTIVITIES

Delta Kappa Gamma is a worldwide educational honor society for women educators with more than 130,000 members throughout the United States and fifteen member countries. Our local chapter, Zeta Zeta, consists of more than 60 women educators from the public and private sector, kindergarten through college, and is composed of a variety of ages, positions, and ethnic backgrounds.

We keep informed and are proactive about legislation that affects education and educators. Our chapter is a service oriented group of educators who meet together each month for the purpose of promoting excellence in education. To that end we directly support many projects that "give back" to society:

- •Backpack Supplies for needy students midyear through VESTIA (Volunteer and Emergency Services Team in Action)
- •Adopt an Angel Holiday Program for Teenagers providing gifts to teens during the holidays
- •World Fellowships supporting fellow educators (over 37 recipients this year internationally)
- •Jessie Falconer Tuition Grants We award thousands of dollars in grants each year to residents of Contra Costa County

who are entering the teaching profession or studying for additional credentials or degrees (without regard to race, religion, gender or age).
