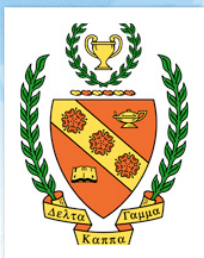

Dr. Goldblum's research interests are in the area of applied nuclear physics, with current emphasis on nuclear data needs for homeland security. She served as a teaching assistant to undergraduates in nuclear physics, radiation detection and nuclear instrumentation and as a lecturer in radiation biophysics

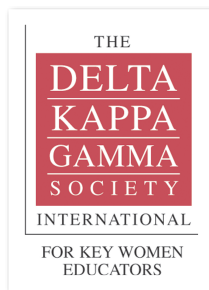
