IX New Business:

PROGRAM: Patti Platt, Deputy Chief Officer for benefits and services at CalSTRS was tonight's speaker. Some highlights of her speech:

Patti shared that teachers live longer and California teachers live the longest.

CalSTRS was founded in 1913 and is in its 98<sup>th</sup> year. It is the second largest public pension fund in the U.S. It has a membership of 850,000 and has never missed a payment. It pays out eight billion dollars a year. The employee contributes 8% of pay, the employer contributes 8.25%, the state 2% and 55% is from investment. In 2000 it was 110% funded, in 2010 it was 71% funded. The year 2009 was the low point; to date this year it is up 20%. It is not necessary to have all the money at any one time. Funding has to be planned for over the long term. She assured us that CalSTRS is secure and will continue to pay benefits.
