- I. Call to order: 6:00 PM, Stephanie Brown-Myers presiding

- IX. President's report-Stephanie Brown-Myers spoke about the upcoming conventions. The State convention will be held in Irvine, May 4-6. Our chapter will be getting the Order of the Rose for having at least 5 initiates or transferees. Members can go to the website for registration information.

The March meeting will be include initiation of our new members.
The April meeting will include a demonstration of iPads.

Stephanie commended Kit King for her exemplary work on our newsletters. A selected newsletter was submitted by Kit to Chi State for review and possible recognition at the Chi State convention.

Members were given a bookmark with a poem entitled “Why Be a Volunteer”. Stephanie compared the poem written by a student, and one printed in a PTA newsletter. There were subtle differences regarding why people volunteer, however, the message is that we all have talents we can share with others.
