Chapter Service Awards

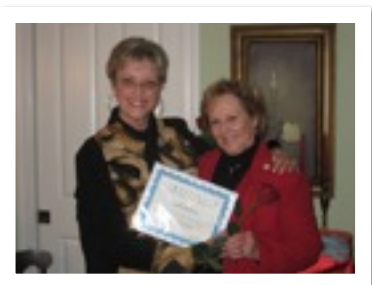
