I pondered my Chinese history professor's descriptions of how this wall was built with the calcium from thousands of broken dreams and broken bones. 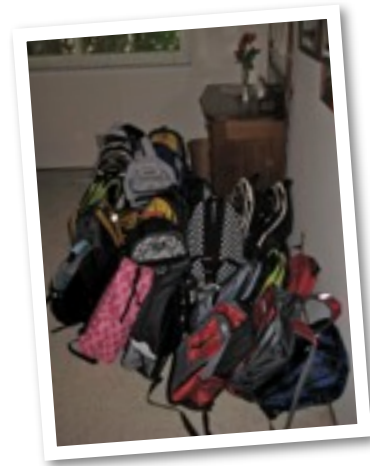
