SERVICE PROJECTS

Pam DeBernardi will be purchasing some more **backpacks** for our next stuffing. Be saving up supplies to put in them such as: rulers, scissors, glue sticks, 3 ring binders and wide-ruled notebook paper, colored pencils, Classic broad-tip markers, crayons, post-its, pencils, pencil boxes, highlighters, stuffed animals, small toys, erasers, and new or slightly used paperback books for K-2, 3-6 grades.

Shepherd's Gate is a women shelter in Livermore that serves abused and homeless women and their children. Zeta Zeta supports literacy there through a program called Pay It Forward Literary Enrichment, started in 2002 by **Kit King**. If you can bring supplies such as kleenex, toilet tissue, paper towels, plates, napkins, laundry detergent, soap, women's hygiene products, etc, that would be a tremendous help to the residents. Our chapter is being awarded a LIFE Foundation Award Grant for continuing support of this literacy program.
