WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE LEGISLATURE?

DON'T LET THIS HAPPEN TO YOU (US):

The Social Security Fairness Act was introduced in the Senate in December 2011 which would repeal the unfair Government Pension Offset (GPO) and Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) that prevents a member of STRS who receives a pension from getting ANY Social Security benefits that he/she has earned in their lifetime.

For example: I worked over 10 years in private industry before going into education. My Social Security report states that I will receive \$410 per month at age 66-but at the end of the report it also states that under GPO and WEP I may NOT receive ANY of that money because I receive a public pension. This effects many members of DKG and may very well effect you too, so please ask all of your friends and fellow teachers/administrators to e-mail, write or call Senator

Feinstein and Senator Boxer to let them know that you/we support the Social Security Fairness Act that REPEALS the unfair GPO and WEP.
