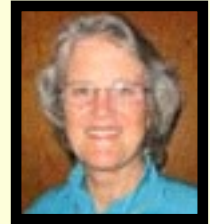

We were fortunate to hear from **Mamie Chow** at our February joint meeting with AAUW. Mamie spent the first fifteen years of her professional life in social justice organizations, focusing on racial and gender equity, quality education, and equal access to resources for everyone. Mamie spoke from the heart saying that people need to work together to create change and spent much of her time in those fifteen years building political collaborations in Oakland.



Mamie is a 2nd degree black belt in Tae Kwon Do. She is passionate about women experiencing first-hand the mental and physical power that can come from this mind-body practice. Mamie decided to go back to school to become a traditional Chinese medical practitioner after experiencing IBS for 30 years and having four different Western medical doctors use many unsuccessful invasive and uncomfortable procedures. When she finally went to a traditional Chinese medicine practitioner who suggested acupuncture, she was helped. She credits it all to Traditional Chinese Medicine.

Since then she has pursued her dream of becoming a licensed practitioner by completing her MA in Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) at the Academy of Chinese Culture and Healthy Sciences in Oakland. TCM is a broad range of medicine practices

sharing common concepts which have been developed in China and are based on a tradition of more than 2,000 years, including various forms of herbal medicine, acupuncture, massage (Tui na), exercise (qigong), and dietary therapy. She is in her last year of school and hopes to pass the CALE (California Acupuncture License Exam) upon completion of her courses. What she loves most is developing healthy rapport with her clients and using tiny needles and 2,000 year old formulas to alleviate pain and strengthen the mind-body-spirit connection. Her vision is to increase access to quality healthcare of women and girls from marginalized communities and support the healing process of trauma survivors. Way to go, Mamie!

Legislative Links

Report from **Mary Lembke**

The Governor's Budget: Individual districts are meeting to give input on the proposals now. These is a very brief summary.

Provides for \$10 billion for public education and for paying off all of the remaining deferrals.

Dedicates a certain percentage in Prop. 98 for Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) with the Legislature having no role in making this determination.

Provides for no resources for the implementation of the Common Core State Standards. \$46.5 million is proposed to implement the provisions of the revised student assessment system.

As suggested by the Legislative Analyst, sets aside some money in the next budget process for the state's adoption of a long-term CalSTRS funding plan.

State Department of Education (SDE) has announced a tool designed to deliver information about the Smarter Balanced Field Test. Send a blank email to CAASPP@mlist.cde.ca.gov to received specific information about the tests directly.

CalPERS Long Term Care Insurance: Herein are phone numbers you might find useful: relating to your policy: 800-982-1775; relating to premium increases 888-877-4934.

The Federal government has made an exception for the State of California to suspend statewide testing for this year so the State Department of Education can develop test specific to the Common Core Curriculum. There will be no penalty.
