

FEBRUARY Meeting Highlights

Linda Turnbull spoke to us about **Teen Esteem**, and helping 200,000 students build up their self image over the years in Livermore, San Ramon, Pleasanton, and up and down the 24 corridor.

Today's children are stressed with academic and social expectations, and they suffer panic attacks. The internet (and cyber bullying) has such a negative impact on their self-image. Did you know that suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death in young people ages 11-18? Linda uses a tea cup illustration to show children that they aren't like a disposable red plastic Solo cup, but instead they are like a fine china cup and are unique, treasured and irreplaceable.

Teen Esteem is part of Awareness Education giving kids tools to make healthy choices in grade school and middle school. **Pat Hanson**, Principal at Vista Grande School, introduced Linda, and told us that Teen Esteem gave her school one of the best assemblies they have ever had.



February 2018

Hello Members, the California Department of Education has provided the following updates on the continued implementation of California's Common Core Standards. The webinar is past, but there are opportunities for local input.



I. Opportunities to Participate

Rollout Events for the History–Social Science Framework

The California Department of Education is co-sponsoring rollout events in several locations in conjunction with the California History–Social Science Project, the California County Superintendents Educational Services Association, and other organizations. See below for a list of scheduled rollout events. Register early—these rollout events fill up quickly.

These one-day conferences provide a full-day examination of the instructional shifts, updated and expanded content, aligning history–social science instruction with the *English Language Arts/English Language Development Framework*, and inquiry-based instruction across grade levels.

Educational Highlights of Governor's Proposed Budget for 2018-19:

- Proposes a new high school career technical education program (\$212 million).
- Creates an online community college (\$100 million one-time, \$20 million ongoing) which will offer Child Development Credentialing.
- Provides \$6.3 billion for K-12, Community Colleges, and preschools (a \$465 per pupil increases for K-12).
- Provides \$4.4 million for preschool programs, including Transitional Kindergarten (a 9% increase from last year and expands Full-Day State Preschool slots).
- Funds a new system or regional/county support for low-performing school districts (\$70 million).
- Provides \$640 million for construction/modernizations of public and charter facilities.
- Provides \$28.3 million to align Charter School Facility Grant Program funding.

National Forum:

CHIP Funding: We are still waiting for renewal of the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) with expiration date of March 31.



Title IX: Representative Susan Brooks and Senator Dianne Feinstein are currently working on legislation to address sexual assault on college campuses.

Don't forget TAKE ACTION THURSDAY: California Retired Teachers Association (CalTRA) promotes ongoing legislative action to repeal the Windfall Elimination provision (WEP and the Government Pension Offset (GPO) every Thursday.
